Link *your* legacy to the founder of Rotary

Paul and Jean Harris married in 1910. Two years later they acquired a hilltop home on a large plot of land on Longwood Drive in Chicago. In *My Road to Rotary*, Paul explains he named their home ***Comely Bank*** after the street in Edinburgh Scotland where Jean spent her childhood and youth. They lived in this home from 1912 until Paul's death in 1947. Soon afterward Jean Harris returned to her native Scotland. A representative of the Rotary Heritage & History International Fellowship of Rotarians (RHHIF) visited the house about a decade before the 100th anniversary of Rotary. We learned that the current owner was just the second family to live there since the Harris family, and that very few changes to the home had been made. RHHIF's *Comely Bank Committee* was spun off as the **Paul & Jean Harris Home Foundation (PJHHF)**.

Fellowship members helped PJHHF raise the down payment. A loan was obtained from *Naperville Rotary Club* in time to purchase ***Comely Bank*** just before Rotary's centennial convention. Today funds are needed to repay *Naperville Rotary Club's* loan, complete repairs, furnish the home, and prepare it for use by the Rotarians of today.
