Naperville Rotarians saved *Comely Bank*

The fellowship thanks the many Rotarians — attorneys, architects, structural engineers, and historic preservation experts, whose advice and encouragement made it possible to accomplish this challenging and historic goal.

Naperville Charities, formed by members of the Rotary Club of Naperville Illinois, loaned the half million dollars required to buy the house. Harris Home Sponsoring clubs and districts donated funds to restore the home to the way it looked during Paul's lifetime and to add modern conveniences required to convert the building from a single family residence into a public gathering place in compliance with ADA code.

To repay the Naperville loan and maintain the home for use by Rotarians after the Rotary Centennial Convention., donations are still needed.

Harris and first club president Silvester Schiele and created the monument and walkway honoring RI Presidents.

Currently fellowship members are helping the Paul & Jean Harris Home Foundation purchase and prepare the Harris Home for tours by Centennial Conventioneers. Lend a hand with these efforts.
