...will take place at 3:30 pm in the Roosevelt Warm Springs' historic Quadrangle with special guest speakers expected to include surviving family members of the original inductees.


Among those expected to attend are: Dr. Peter Salk, eldest son of vaccine developer Jonas Salk; Missouri Congressman Ike Skelton, a former Warm Springs polio patient as a teenager, now chairman of the U. S. House Armed Services Committee; the widows of Albert Sabin and Joseph Melnick, Basil O'Connor's granddaughter plus at least one Roosevelt grandchild.

Each of the 4 inductee organizations will be represented.

The 17 original inductees included leaders and scientists responsible for the development of the vaccines that eradicated polio in this country and much of

the modern world, whereas the 4 new inductees are working together to eliminate the disease in third world countries, thus completing global eradication.

Georgia Department of Labor Commissioner Michael Thurmond will welcome participants to Roosevelt Warm Springs which is now owned and operated by his department. The campus dates back to President Franklin D. Roosevelt's time.

New Inductees will be enshrined on a large bronze plaque detailing their contributions to ongoing eradication efforts. Contributions of the original inductees will be better highlighted with a matching plaque. Both will be permanently placed in front of the existing monument.
